## **Do Victim Impact Statements Predict** the Likelihood of an Offender Expressing Remorse, Issuing an **Apology, or Taking Responsibility?**

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## Victim Impact Statements

- Victims may use victim impact statements to assist them in reaching their goals during offender sentencings
- What is a victim impact statement? (VIS)

- Allows victims to communicate their experiences to the judge, the offender, and the wider community (Booth, 2014)

- Restorative qualities (Booth, 2014)

- The most common delivery methods of VIS are written and oral statements (De Mesmaecker, 2012)

## **VIS and Sentencing**

- Some victims believe their
  VIS will influence sentencing
  (De Mesmaecker, 2012).
- A recent Canadian study of sentencing rulings found no VIS – sentencing relationship (Dufour et al, 2023).



# What is the relationship between VIS and offender – related outcomes?

## Variables

#### Remorse

- Acknowledgment of the stress and turmoil caused and taking personal responsibility for the pain inflicted on the victim (Hola et al., 2018).
- May encourage offenders to make amends and apologize for the wrongdoings they have committed (Hola et al., 2018).

#### Apology

• A social action that signifies to the victim and society that the offender recognizes their wrongdoings (Proeve, 2023).

 Many victims view an apology from the offender as one of the most important outcomes of the court proceeding (Bonwsteffen & Giebels, 2020).

#### Responsibility

- Victims perceive offenders as intending to repair harm when they demonstrate sufficient responsibility (Bonwsteffen & Giebels, 2020)
- The offender should make sincere efforts to make amends, fix broken relationships, and repair the harm caused (Choi & Severson, 2009).



### **Research Questions**

#### **QUESTION 1**

What is the relationship between VIS and the offender expressing remorse?

#### **QUESTION 2**

What is the relationship between VIS and the offender issuing an apology?

#### **QUESTION 3**

What is the relationship between VIS and the offender taking responsibility?



## **Methods**

- N = 877 cases of sentencing rulings from 2016-2018 found from CanLII
- Codebook containing
  variables
- Remorse, apology, and responsibility
- Victim impact statement

## Results

#### **QUESTION 1**

No relationship between a victim impact statement and remorse (n = 622, X = .008, p = .931)

#### **QUESTION 2**

No relationship between a victim impact statement and apology (n = 259, X = .423, p = .515)

#### **QUESTION 3**

No relationship between a victim impact statement and responsibility (n = 432, X = .836, p = .360)



## **Concluding Remarks**

• These findings suggest that victims are unlikely to receive offender remorse, apology, or responsibility when giving a VIS
